Food: Barbeque, funnel cakes, seafood, home-style cooking, Chinese, ice cream, and more!

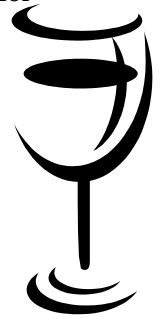

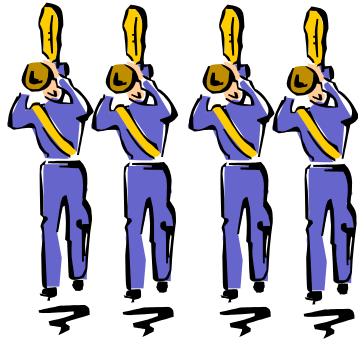

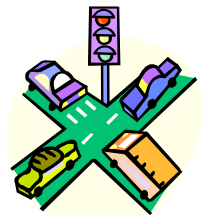


From the town manager's desk
