We have acquired 3 Wineries to-date, and expect more to join.

Marterella..... Located in the unspoiled heart of Virginia Horse & Wine Country North of Old Town Warrenton, *Marterella Winery* is the lifetime dream of Virginia native *Kate Marterella* come true. *Kate* is a boutique producer of high quality, premium Virginia Wines specializing in small lot production. The winery is nestled in the middle of her 8 acre vineyard (Falcon Glen Vineyard) currently planted in Cabernet Franc, Pinot Grigio, Merlot, Petit Manseng, Vidal Blanc, and Chambourcin.

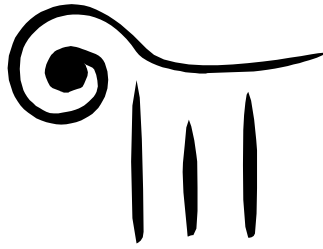
Three Fox Vineyards..... For years, John and Holli Todhunter had planned to establish a vineyard and winery, possibly as a retirement venture. But they could not resist the allure of the wine industry and decided not to wait. The Todhunters are very fond of Italian and southern French wines and food. For the past few years they have visited Italy annually, and thought if they were to produce wines, it would be in the style of Italian wines. As they were visiting the property with a real estate agent, Holli spotted three foxes during their visit, and that sealed the bargain for "Three Fox Vineyards". Now with the property, the Todhunters began the long hours planting five different varietals: Viognier, Pinot Grigio, Cabernet Franc, Sangiovese, and Nebbiolo. "We decided that we would buy rather than plant Chardonnay as there was already an ample supply in Virginia". They added Merlot and Chambourcin in 2005. Three Fox Vineyards is now producing their own estate wines and you can enjoy the "fruits" of their labors in the tasting room, outside on the patio, in the meadow next to Crooked Run, or on one of many other scenic spots on 50 rolling acres.

Unicorn Winery..... When the Virginia wine industry became popular in the late 1980's, it prompted Dave Whittaker to take a grape growing course. Soon after he began looking for land for a vineyard and in 1993 found a suitable location on the banks of the Rappahannock river. In the following year, he purchased the equipment needed to start a winery and planted his own grapes. He also acquired an existing structure to house the winery as well as his wine shop and tasting area, and renamed it the "Grape Barn". In the summer of 1999, the fruition of his dream became uncertain due to the difficulty of finding an experienced winemaker. As luck would have it, he was able to attract the interest of Chris Pearmund, a well known and highly regarded wine master. Together they managed to create a "herd" of 8 wines, from dry to sweet, using Dave's grapes, Seyval from Breaux Vineyards and Chardonnay from Chris's Meriwether Vineyard. Their 1999 Inaugural Chardonnay & Viognier both won gold medals at the 2000 Virginia State Fair.

Giuseppe's is conveniently located just west of the intersection of Fayette and Washington streets and directly across Washington Street from Winterham.



For over 25 years Joe and Josie Russo, both native Sicilians, have provided this area with delicious and authentic Italian cuisine. The Russo's built the beautiful Haymarket restaurant in 2006 with a desire to not only provide quality food at great prices, but to offer this area a dining facility that has everything. The covered front porch, where dining and drinks are encouraged, provides a warm invitation into this friendly atmosphere. The entrance level has a separate bar/lounge area to the left and a large dining room on the right. Upstairs is the large banquet facility (that stays booked up) and additional dining.

Giuseppe's menu features authentic Sicilian food such as arancini (\$7.95) (deep fried rice balls stuffed with ground beef, green peas & prosciutto), lobster ravioli (\$16.95), the popular favorite chicken stuffed with spinach, crabmeat & cheese (\$15.95), gnocchi alla vodka (\$12.95), and much much more!!

All entrees are served with your choice of soup or salad and warm freshly made bread.

Don't forget that Giuseppe's offers a variety of subs. All subs & sandwiches are made-to-order on home-made bread that is baked daily! Prices range from \$7.95 to \$9.95.

Pizza is also a speciality as Giuseppe's. They offer both thin crust and Sicilian-style thick crust pizza. Toppings are fresh and both the sauce and dough are home-made daily. Pizza prices range from \$7.99 for a small cheese (10") to a large (16") Pizza Carinese (shrimp, calamari, mussels, and clams) for \$19.95.

I would like to remind all Town residents that decals were due on vehicles by April 15 of this year. If you are a new resident, you have 30 days to obtain your decals. Please be reminded that the Town Hall issues these decals from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday. The cost is \$15/decals. Military, police, fire and rescue personnel and residents over the age of 65 receive decals at no charge.

MUSEUM CORNER

After visiting the Haymarket museum one Saturday, Mike Kidwell kindly e-mailed this circa 1920 photograph of his grandmother, Lillian Brady and her brother, Harry, standing on the bridge that used to span North Fork Creek at the southern end of Jefferson Street. The Brady family lived for a short time in the small wooden house still standing at the southern corner of Jefferson and Fayette Streets. The bridge, which was still in use well into the 1970's was only wide enough for one car, so if two cars approached it at the same time one would have to pull over to allow the other to pass. Along with this photograph, Mr. Kidwell provided two others along with some of his grand-

FROM THE TOWN MANAGER'S DESK.....

Over the next few weeks you will see quite a bit of activity along Washington Street as we move ahead with clean-up and repair projects to improve the appearance of the Town. The upcoming projects are as follows:

1. Street Cleaning: We will sweep the streets to remove the sand and debris that has accumulated along Washington Street.
 2. Crosswalk repair: We will be placing a temporary patch on the crosswalk at the north intersection of Washington and Jefferson Streets. The permanent repair of the crosswalk, to be completed in the fall, will be the replacement of the brick on the crosswalk with "Stamped Asphalt". Stamped asphalt looks like brick but will not crumble and is much less expensive to maintain.
 3. Washington Street Cut: A storm water pipe will be installed on Washington Street near the intersection of Fayette Street. The completion of the pipe installation will allow the work at the Winterham property to move ahead.
 4. The Caboose: The caboose at the Town Museum will be painted to cover the graffiti and to brighten up the exterior.
- We appreciate your patience as we move ahead with these projects. We will continue our beautification efforts to maintain Haymarket as one of Virginia's most attractive small towns.
