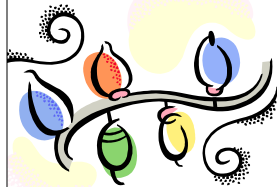

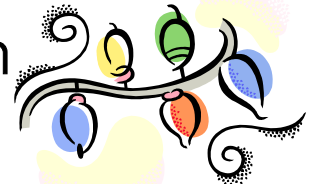

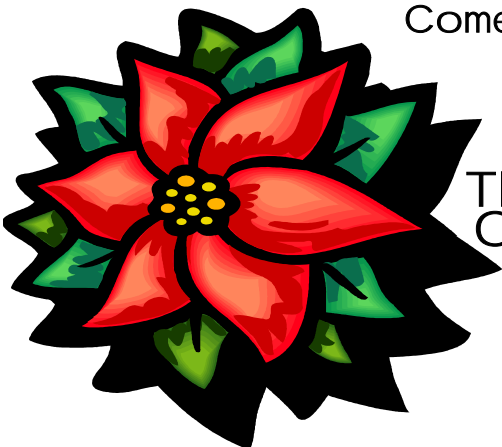

The coats for kids foundation was established in January 2004 as a public, charitable foundation by Paul and Cheryl Darby of Alexandria, VA. Coats for kids received recognition by the IRS as a 501(c)(3) in March 2004. The coats for kids mission is "to ensure that every child who needs a winter coat receives a new one".

Coats for kids distinguishes itself from other used coat distribution programs that operate only in November –December by distributing only new winter coats each with a new pair of gloves, and a new hat and by responding to requests throughout the entire winter-October through March.



The town is participating, from November 9 through December 15 in a drive to provide these new coats to those needing in our Haymarket area. New coats can be dropped off at the town hall during normal business hours (8am-4:30pm).

Contributions are fully tax deductible. A written receipt can be provided for each contribution received.

Museum news

I was looking through some old photographs that belonged to my grandmother and found this photo of Sarah Turner, former chair of the Haymarket Historical commission and the leading advocate for the creation of the Haymarket Museum, circa 1930. She is on the right, standing next to my Aunt Anne. I remember Sarah telling me that when she was young she and her mother lived for a while near my great-grandmother's house, which was located off present day Beverley's Mill Road in Broad Run. I assume this was taken there since my grandmother and her husband were living in Bethesda, Maryland in 1930. I wish I had come across this photo when Sarah was alive; it would have been fun to share it with her and it just goes to show what treasures might be in those piles of old photos that we all have lying around the house. So any of you who have lived in Haymarket for many years, dig into your old photos and see if anything interesting shows up!

If you haven't been to the museum in a while there are two new reasons to visit. There is an exhibit about the life and published works of Alice Maude Ewell (1860-1946), a local author who lived all of her life at the foot of Bull Run Mountain near present day Log Mill Road and Route 15 and is buried at St. Paul's Church. There is also an exhibit about two stores: Jordan and Jordan General Merchandise and Melton's Store both of which, over the course of 100 years, occupied the same building on Washington Street on the site where the BB&T Bank now stands. I hope you'll have an opportunity to stop by any Saturday from 10:30-3:30 through December 15, when we'll close for the winter.
